On the other hand, Brazil which is a key player for the global trade of grains is suffering from domestic political issues, which have caused disruptions to the transportations of coffee, soybeans, wheat and fertilizers to the ports of the country, a fact that also increases uncertainty. It is the right time through our countries' business communities, especially now that the restrictive measssures of covid have loosened to boost both tourism and agriculture in order to strengthen our economies and promote economic and social welfare.
